**RED ALERT****Re: Reproductive Health Act**

The Governor and legislative leaders have promised to pass a dangerous proposal called the "Reproductive Health Act" early in the 2019 legislative session. The bill has now been introduced and it is numbered S.240 and A.21. It would eliminate New York's current restrictions on late-term abortion, empower non-doctors to perform abortions, remove protections against unwanted or coerced abortions, and even legalize infanticide of live born infants.
