October is a very special month in the Church calendar. There are so many feast days and memorials that are worth celebrating. Here are just a few of them.

I don't know about you, but October is a stacked deck full of great saints to commemorate and emulate. Saint Therese of LIsieux is certainly a favorite of many. She had so many aspirations in her life. She wanted to be a great missionary and spread the Gospel to the far corners of the world, and yet she said yes when God called her to be in the Carmelite cloister where she found the true happiness that only God can give. How you may ask? In her autobiography called "The Story of a Soul" Saint Therese explains that she didn't know how to live up to the great lives of the saints, "For me to become great is impossible. I must bear with myself and my many imperfections; but I will seek out a means of getting to Heaven by a little way-very short and very straight, a little way that is wholly new."

This little way is simply in keeping faithful in performing little virtues. Not to seek grandiose sacrifices, but only little acts of holiness. She imagined herself as a little child that is still learning to walk. At times the little one will fall, but the act of getting up again and trying to walk until you succeed to be in your parents' arms gives such great joy to both mother and father. Similarly, our Heavenly Father looks upon us with such great love as we strive for holiness in our lives.

St. Therese did not leave the Carmelite monastery, she didn't become a missionary or a great martyr for the faith. But she was content in her littleness because God was. If it were not for her autobiography, her story as well as the "Little Way" might have been completely lost to history. But God chose to shine upon the littleness of St. Therese and bless us with her example and holy life, so that we too can pursue our relationship with God through the Little Way.
