From The Desk of Fr. Paul

This Friday, October 28th, we celebrate the Feast Day of two great apostles, Saint Simon and Saint Jude. They are celebrated together because as missionaries they both served the people of Persia where they were eventually martyred for their faith in Jesus. I want to highlight Saint Jude in particular today because he is the patron of hopeless cases.

In Jesus' time, Judah was a very common name. In fact, Jesus chose two apostles with this very name. As with many Hebrew names there can be many different variations according to their translations in Greek and Latin. In the Gospels, we know them as Judas Thaddeus and Judas Iscariot, Judas being the Latin variation. In the early Church, Christians were so afraid of honoring Judas Iscariot, the apostle and traitor who betrayed Jesus, that Saint Jude was often named Judas Thaddeus not to mistake him for Judas Iscariot. For example, in the Last Supper discourses in John 14, it reads, "Judas, not the Iscariot, said to him..." The fear of confusion between the two may have even caused our lack of material on Saint Jude's apostolic and missionary life. The name "Jude" comes from the anglicized form of Judas. For the benefit of your reading of Scripture, both in Luke, John and the Acts of the Apostles the name Judas or Jude is used, however in Matthew and Mark the name Thaddeus is used.

Saint Jude is the patron saint of hopeless cases. Saint Jude Children's Research Hospital was named after this very same apostle when it was founded by Danny Thomas in the 1950's. It is said that he did so in order to keep a vow he had to Saint Jude if he was successful in fundraising for this project. This is certainly a testament to how Saint Jude remains an invaluable patron for those in hopeless cases. It is unknown exactly when Saint Jude was attributed this title. However, throughout Church history, many miracles have been recorded about his intercession in hopeless cases. One probable reason for his patronage may come from the early Church historian Eusebius. In his account (which is not in Scripture), he wrote about when Jesus was still in his public ministry, he was requested to heal the ruler of Edessa, Agbar V. Jesus sent Saint Jude to carry on Jesus' healing ministry to Agbar and he was healed.

Here is a traditional prayer to Saint Jude that can be prayed for whatever impossible case you may find yourself in:

Most holy Apostle, Saint Jude, faithful servant and friend of Jesus, the Church honors and invokes you universally, as the patron of difficult cases, of things almost despaired of, pray for me, I am so helpless and alone. Intercede with God for me that He bring visible and speedy help where help is almost despaired of. Come to my assistance in this great need that I may receive the consolation and help of heaven in all my necessities, tribulations, and sufferings, particularly [make your request here] and that I may praise God with you and all the saints forever. I promise, O blessed Saint Jude, to be ever mindful of this great favor granted me by God and to always honor you as my special and powerful patron, and to gratefully encourage devotion to you. Amen.
