CATHOLIC CEMETERY MOMENT

If you are considering cremation, it is well to discuss your choice with your family, as well as your parish priest or the Diocesan Catholic Cemetery Office. Cremation is allowed, but there are certain preferences and stipulations. Be aware that the cremated remains of a body must be buried or entombed, preferably in a Catholic cemetery. The Church does not allow the scattering cremated remains, dividing cremated remains, or keeping cremated remains in the home.



THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

The prayers and mysteries of the Holy Rosary are almost all taken directly from the Bible. They summarize important teachings of the Church. As you say each mystery, picture the scene in your imagination.

The last set of mysteries of the Rosary is the Luminous Mysteries. These mysteries are relatively new, having been introduced by St. Pope John Paul II. They are usually prayed on Thursdays.

The Baptism in the Jordan – The baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist was the institution of the sacrament of Baptism.

The Wedding at Cana – At Mary’s request, Jesus performed His first miracle and, by His presence, Christian marriage was raised to the dignity of a Sacrament.

The Proclamation of the Kingdom – Many times in the Gospels, Jesus referred to His kingdom and what we must do to enter into it.

The Transfiguration – Jesus was transfigured on the mountain before Peter, James, and John. We, too, shall behold the transfigured Jesus on the last day.

The Institution of the Eucharist – At the Last Supper, on the feast of the Passover, Jesus celebrated the first Mass. The Eucharist is a sacrifice inasmuch as it is offered up, and a sacrament inasmuch as it is received. In the Mass we offer ourselves to God, and God gives himself to us.
