**THE MONTH OF
THE HOLY ROSARY**



October is set aside by the Church as the month of the Holy Rosary. Here are some things to consider:

Keep your rosary handy – You are more likely to say the rosary if you don’t have to search for it first. Keep it clean and treat it with respect. It is not ordinarily a necklace or a toy. A blessed rosary is a sacramental and praying it carries an indulgence.

Praying the rosary – If you have time, pause between decades for a personal prayer. On the other hand, if you are really busy, you can divide up the rosary – one decade before breakfast, one while driving to work, and so on.

The rosary is a meditation – As you say each mystery, picture the scene in your imagination.

Appreciate the rosary – The prayers and mysteries are almost all taken directly from the Bible – it is God’s Word. It summarizes important teachings of the Church.

Know the mysteries – The mysteries of the rosary are designed to help focus our prayer on the life, ministry, and Passion of Our Lord. Meditating on the life of Christ with the prayers of the rosary – through the intercession of the Blessed Mother – is a way to grow in faith and deepen your relationship with Christ. The different mysteries are traditionally prayed on different days of the week as follows:

Joyful Mysteries (Monday and Saturday) – the Annunciation of the Lord to Mary, the Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth, the Nativity of our Lord, the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, Finding Jesus in the Temple.

Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesday and Friday) – the Agony in the Garden, the Scourging at the Pillar, Jesus is Crowned with Thorns, Jesus Carries the Cross, the Crucifixion.

Glorious Mysteries (Wednesday and Sunday) – the Resurrection, the Ascension, the Descent of the Holy Ghost, the Assumption of Mary, Mary is Crowned Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Luminous Mysteries (Thursday) – the Baptism of the Lord, the Wedding at Cana, the Proclamation of the Kingdom, the Transfiguration, the Institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper.



ST. JAMES ADORATION

We are blessed to have a local church that has Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament five days a week. In Adoration, one is giving time to the Lord. Each hour an individual is present in the chapel to be with Jesus and guard the Monstrance. It would be ideal to have at least two people as guardians each hour of Adoration.
