

From The Desk of Fr. Paul

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said, "How can there be too many children? That is like saying that there are too many flowers."

Every human life is made in the image and likeness of God and has inherent dignity and therefore worthy of all protections and human rights. The first and foremost of these rights is the right to life.

This month is Respect Life Month. It is our opportunity to recommit ourselves to the protection of all life from conception through natural death; the protection of the most vulnerable among us, babies in the womb.

Following the victory of the overturning of Roe vs. Wade on June 24th of this year, while pro-life America has cause to rejoice, we also recognize that our work to protect life is not over. Our call to action can include many things. We can never underestimate the power prayer because God is listening, and he does answer us. Secondly, we can be mindful of our responsibility politically to hold the pro-life cause as the preeminent issue when voting and to contact our legislators about pro-life concerns. Third, we can help out our local pregnancy care centers by donating funds or goods. Options Care does remarkable work in our Jamestown area to protect life, offering sonograms and to give compassionate and loving care to families at very crucially sensitive times of their lives.

I know that the pro-life issue can be a sensitive topic for many and often times very polarizing. However, in times such as these we should heed the call of Christ to "not be afraid" and to stand with Christ who is the way, the truth and the life. Where our culture demands that we "follow the science", why is it that when the question of "when does life begin" is asked, science cannot answer that question? It is clear from biology that life begins at conception, a full human life, with its own DNA and by six weeks that baby has a heartbeat.

During this month, we ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit to inspire us to pray, hope and take action to defend life in all of its stages, to realize that God has made every person in his own image and likeness and calls us to himself. Our Lady of Victory, pray for
