

From The Desk of Fr. Paul

As you know this month is dedicated to the Rosary and on October 7th, we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This date has special significance since it commemorates the time that Christendom was saved from invasion by the praying of the Rosary. Let me paint the picture for you.

It is no surprise that over the course of centuries there were Crusades with varying degrees of success and outright failure, not to mention that these Crusades exacerbated tensions between the Eastern and Western worlds. But in 1571 these tensions came to a head when the Ottoman Turks threatened to invade mainland Christendom with their superior naval armada. If successful, the very existence of Christianity would have been threatened. In an act of urgent diplomacy, Pope Pius V tried to rally neighboring countries to defend Europe in the Mediterranean Sea near Cyprus. Not all Christian leaders were on board, with some countries spurning the pope's call to action. Despite these setbacks, Pope Pius V pulled together a naval force called the "Holy League" comprising the Spanish Empire, Papal States, Venice, Genoa, Tuscany and Austria. Don Juan of Austria led the Holy League to the Gulf of Patras to face the Ottoman fleet.

While the sequence of the battle events is valiant and noteworthy, the spiritual battle is what I want to highlight the most. First of all, Don Juan wore a relic of the True Cross given to him by Pope Pius V around his neck. Second, every ship had a Mass celebrated on deck before they departed. Third, Don Juan had a replica image of Our Lady of Guadalupe on board his ship to have the Blessed Mother intercede for the success of their mission. What makes this especially noteworthy is that devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe was very recent at that time of history, being Our Lady visited Saint Juan Diego (not to be confused with Don Juan) in Mexico only a short 40 years prior in 1531. After the battle, Don Juan offered tribute to the original image of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico. Fourth and most importantly, Pope Pius V called upon all of Christendom to pray the Rosary for the protection of Christianity. It is said that when the battle was won, Pope Pius V had a spiritual revelation that Christendom was preserved and he exhorted his cardinals, "Let us go and thank God because at this very moment our armada has obtained victory." Renewed devotion to praying the Rosary quickly spread across all of Christendom. I hope that the spiritual components of this battle remind us of the importance of our own devotion and practice of praying the Rosary realizing that we have our own personal battles that we face.

The Rosary remains to this day a most invaluable and powerful devotion. St. Therese of Lisieux said of the Rosary, "The Rosary is a long chain that links heaven and earth. One end of it is in our hands and the other end is in the hands of the Holy Virgin... The Rosary prayer rises like incense to the feet of the Almighty." St. Louis De Montfort wrote in his book "Secrets of the Rosary" that praying the Rosary is like handing roses to the Blessed Mother; roses that will never fade or lose their exquisite beauty. So let us pick up those beads and reestablish the spiritual chain we have to heaven and ask that the Blessed Mother will lead us closer to her Son through the powerful prayer of the Rosary.
