PURGATORY

During the month of November, we are encouraged to pray for the souls in Purgatory. But do we really think about Purgatory and what it means to us as Catholics?

We are blessed to have the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where we can confess our sins and be forgiven for them. But forgiveness does not erase the hurt that has been caused by those sins. No matter how much God loves us, we must do something to repair the damage. Venerable Bishop Fulton Sheen said that we can't just tell God we are sorry and forget about it. He compared it to if every time a person did wrong he was told to drive a nail into the wall of his living room and every time that he was forgiven he was told to pull it out. The holes would remain after the forgiveness. Thus, every sin after being forgiven leaves holes or wounds in our human nature, and the filling of those holes is done by penance. Most of us know we are not doing adequate penance in this life. We know we're not saints. The saints are the clean ones. We want and need to do penance to become clean for the Lord who died for us.

But why do we need to pray for the souls in Purgatory? Because they cannot pray for themselves. They rely on the prayers of those of us here on earth, along with the saints in heaven. In turn, we hope that when those souls have been freed, in part through our prayers, they will pray for us from heaven.
