From the Desk of Fr. Paul

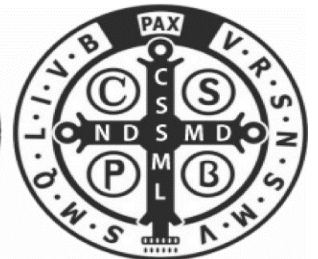
This week on July 11th, we celebrate the humble father of Western monasticism, St. Benedict of Nursia. All this 5th century monk wanted to be a hermit in the mountains, dedicating his life to prayer and relationship with God. But God had other plans for him. His wisdom drew many to his remote hermitage and others wanted to live his rule of life. So, St. Benedict instituted multiple monasteries throughout Europe. Wherever these monasteries arose, peasants and commoners settled because the generosity of the monks brought peace and prosperity. It seemed to be that the monks brought respite in a feudal society that often took advantage of those in poorer classes. St. Benedict had his monks live the Rule of Life, a strict regimen of what he called *ora et labora* which means “prayer and work.” The life of St. Benedict and his monks became the foundation for many other religious orders that appeared throughout Church history.

What I want to share with you is the St. Benedict medal. It is a powerful sacrament that reminds us of the spiritual warfare that we encounter each and every single day. It is so powerful that the St. Benedict Cross (a crucifix with the St. Benedict medal attached to it) is used during exorcisms to this day. The double-sided medal features the image of St. Benedict and on the reverse side a series of letters that stand for two phrases in Latin. Below you can find an image of both sides of the medal to follow along. Within the Cross is inscribed CSSML and NDSMD which stands for *Crux Sacra Sit Mihi Lux* and *Non-Draco Sit Mihi Dux*. This translates to, “the Sacred Cross is my light” and “the devil is not my guide.” The inscription that encircles the medal (*VRSNSMVMQLIVB*) stands for *Vade retro Satana, numquam sade mihi vana, sunt mala quae libas ipse vena bibas*, which means “Begone Satan, never tempt me with your vanities, what you offer me is evil, drink your own poison.”

This is a powerful prayer that is available to us whenever we encounter temptations big or small. While we don’t need to remember the whole prayer, we may commit to memory, “begone Satan” and my personal favorite, “drink your own poison.” We pray through St. Benedict’s intercession that we may always have the Sacred Cross be our light and that we may turn away from the ways of the evil one. St. Benedict pray for us!
