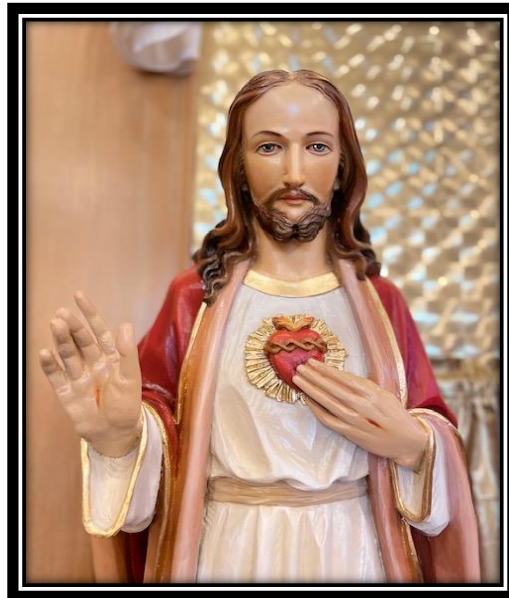

FROM OUR PASTOR

James 2:14-18 – 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Faith without works is dead"

Today's second reading discusses the part that 'faith' and 'works' play in the plan of salvation. Following the Protestant Reformation Martin Luther incorrectly taught we are saved "by faith alone". The phrase "by faith alone" appears in Scripture just once, where it is flatly rejected: "See how a person is justified by works and not by faith alone" (James 2:24). There are three kinds of works mentioned in the New Testament. Works of the Law (Rom 3:28-31; Gal 2:16) refers to ceremonial observances of the old or Mosaic Law such as circumcision: and works "so as to boast" (Rom 2:23; Rom 4:1-6) which suggest to some that one can "earn" heaven. These two types of works play no part in our salvation. The third kind of works, those that contribute to our salvation are works that are inspired by God's grace, operating through faith in Christ (Eph 2:8-10). To have any supernatural value all good works, those of Divine Love and charity, must be done in the grace of God. The Bible is clear, we will be judged according to our works (Rom 2:6-8; Gal 5:21; Gal 6:6-10 and many more). Salvation is a lifelong process, not a one-time act. We have been saved, (Rom 8:24; Eph 2:5-8, 2Tim 1:9; Tit 3:5); we are being saved, (Phil 2:12; 1Pet 1:9) and we will be saved (Mt 10:22, Mt 24:13), as long as we cooperate with God's Grace.

We are saddened to hear of the passing of Fr. Dennis Mende on Wednesday, September 8th. We hold his family and parishioners in our hearts and in our prayers.

Eternal Rest, grant unto him O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in everlasting peace.
