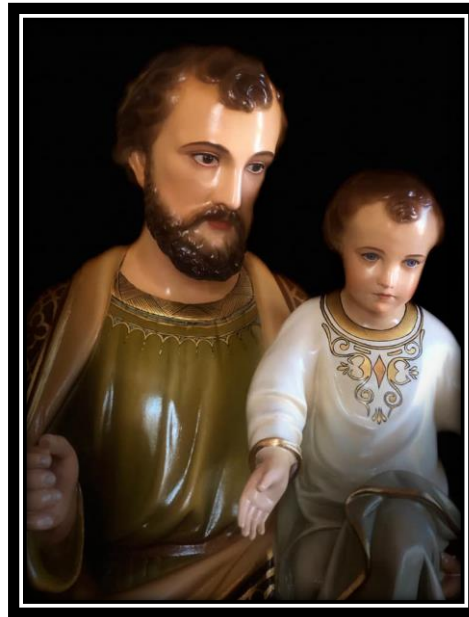

FROM OUR PASTOR

Mark 9:30-37 – Sunday Ordinary Time **"Jesus, Example of Humility"**

The secret of becoming humble lies in Jesus Himself: "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all" (v35). From the moment of His conception Jesus shows us the way. His taking on human nature is the most astounding act of humility we will ever see: "(He) did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant" (Phil 2:7). Then, throughout His life, He did nothing but what His Father wanted Him to do (Jn 5:19). Finally, in great humility, He even submitted to the cross. To those who find themselves burdened with pride and worry, Jesus says: "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gently and humble of heart" (Mt 11:29). Every day we can take one more step along the path of humility as we meditate on Jesus' words. We take one more step as we praise and worship Him, and another step every time we obey His commandments. The key to humility lies in the abiding presence of Jesus, the Humble One, in our hearts.
