October is the Month of the Rosary

4 tips for Real Life Families on How to Pray a Rosary

- 1. Start Small**-You first need to ask yourself: what is your ultimate goal. Once a week? Or everyday? Maybe say one decade a day or the whole Rosary together once a week. Starting small will help you from being overwhelmed
- 2. Know your families limitations**- If you have small children with short attentions spans, consider saying 1 decade at a time. Say one decade before breakfast, lunch, or dinner. If you have older children who are in a lot of activities, maybe saying it in the car together works best. Work around your obstacles.
- 3. Don't Force it.** Praying together as a family should be a gift. Don't speak about it as if it is drainings, a requirement, (or worse) a punishment. Be positive.
- 4. Make it your own.** Get your children personally involved. Have everyone choose their own prayer intention for that particular Rosary or decade.
- 5. Remember a Family Rosary** is never going to be perfect. So don't sweat the small stuff. The most important thing to God is that you are praying together as family!

FROM THE PASTOR

Mark 10th 17-30 – 28th Sunday Ordinary Time
"Eternal Life" – At What Price?

"What must I do to enter into eternal life?" (v17). John Paul II had a response to this question: "...heed the call of Christ when you hear him saying to you: "Follow me! Walk in my path! Stand at my side! Remain in my love!" There is a choice to be made: a choice for Christ and his way of life, and his commandment of love...If you really accept that love from Christ, it will lead you to God...Whatever you make of your life, let it be something that reflects the love of Christ...The sadness of the young man makes us reflect. We could be tempted to think that many possessions, many of the goods of this world, can bring happiness. We see instead the young man's...many possessions, had become an obstacle to accepting the call of Jesus to follow him. He was not ready to say "yes" to Jesus, and "no" to self, to say "yes" to love and "no" to escape. Real love is demanding...Love demands effort and a personal commitment to the will of God. It means discipline and sacrifice, but it also means joy and human fulfillment" (John Paul II, Homily of Boston Common.)
