Believe it or not.... Lent will begin on **March 2, 2022**. I know it feels like it was just the Christmas Season. We know that people are extraordinarily busy. We want to give a gentle reminder to start preparing for the journey of Lent. So much is going on in the world and it is more important than ever to think ahead and to journey through Lent with prayer. We have some concrete ways that you can begin to get ready.

First, let's start by going to confession. Let's get our interior ready for Lent. No need to wait until the Lenten Season to begin. You can make an appointment or come see Father Piotr on Saturdays from 3:15pm to 3:45pm.

Secondly, attend Mass. Everything else you do during Lent is for naught if you don't put it into practice at Mass. And why wouldn't we want to spend some time weekly with our Father in Heaven, thanking Him for all his blessings and receiving Him in the Eucharist. If you have missed Mass recently or haven't gone to confession because of the pandemic, or for any reason. Now is the time to start setting things right before Lent.

**FROM THE PASTOR**

**1 Corinthians 12:31 - 13:13- 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time**  
**"The Virtue of Love"**

Charity is the most essential element in Christian life. God first loved us: and what He desires of us is that we should love Him above all and love one another out of love for God (CCC1822). The love of Christ desires from us is the kind described by St. Paul in today's second reading. This love sets us free (CCC1828). Christian love consists in an intimate participation in the life of God who is love (1JN 4:8, 16). Love makes strong demands. The first and greatest commandment is that we should love God, but have you ever asked why? "Well, because our happiness consists in love of God; it can consist in nothing else. So, if we do not love God, we will always be unhappy; and if we wish to enjoy any consolation and relief in our pains, we will attain it only by recourse to love of God" (St. John Mary Vianney, selected sermons)
