From The Desk of Fr. Paul

Can you believe it? We are already lighting the fourth candle of the Advent wreath with Christmas being on a week away! I'm sure that many of us will be making our last week preparations. Christmas shopping and decorating. But I will always remember a favorite saying of my pastor growing up in Olean, Fr. Greg Dobson. "Don't get your tinsel in a tangle" A short little reminder of inviting the peace of the Lord into this blessed season of Advent leading up to Christmas.

This Saturday, December 17th, we begin the period of "Late Advent" which includes a series of prayers that are unique to this time. These prayers are called the O Antiphons. The O Antiphons are found withing the Liturgy of the Hours before the prayer of the Magnificat during Evening Prayer (the Liturgy of the Hours is mandatory prayer for priests, deacons and religious orders). Even though the Liturgy of the Hours is a mandatory for priests, deacons and religious, anyone is free to pray this beautiful prayer of the Church. I like to mention the O Antiphons to all parishioners because oftentimes only those who are ordained or are consecrated religious will know them.

There are seven O Antiphons. Each of them contains a Messianic title that is derived form the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. The grouping of seven of them can date back all the way to $5^{\rm th}$ century French Benedictine monks who sang these antiphons during the Advent season.

Here are the antiphons in order. I will give the Latin or Hebrew names first and then the English:

Dec. 17th - O Sapientia	O Wisdom	Isaiah 11:2-3
Dec. 18th - O Adonai (Hebrew)	O Lord	Isaiah 11:4-5
Dec. 19th - O Radix Jesse	O Flower of Jesse's Stem	Isaiah 11:1
Dec. 20th - O Clavis David	O Key of David	Isaiah 22:22
Dec. 21st - O Oriens	O Radiant Dawn	Isaiah 9:1
Dec. 22nd - O Rex Gentium	O King of all the Nations	Isaiah 9:5
Dec. 23rd - O Emmanuel	O Emmanuel (God is with us	s) Isaiah 7:14

The French Benedictine Monks arranged the Antiphons in such a way that it would make a mnemonic structure. If you arrange the first letters of each O Antiphon in backwards order it would look like this: ERO Cras stemming from Emmanuel Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapient. In Latin, ERO CRAS means "Tomorrow, I will come." Certainly, a fascinating wordplay that was used to aid the monks in commemorating the importance of the last few days of Advent

We can reflect on each of these O Antiphons as each day goes by this week and remind ourselves of how Christ is the fulfillment of all the Messianic prophecies of the Old Testament and have our minds focused on adoring the Lord with these beautiful titles. May God bless you in this Late Advent season and draw you closer to the Christ Child this Christmas season!
