Adult Faith Formation

Lent is an important season in the Church's liturgical year – it is a time when we take stock of where we are in our faith and prepare for the death and resurrection of our Savior. Often, we lose sight of the point of the season because we get caught up in ourselves-how hard it is too fast, how bad we are at fasting-and we end up waiting for the season to be over at Easter.

Because of this, we often arrive at Easter with our lives no different than they were on Ash Wednesday.

As a parish, we are seeking to prepare for Jesus' death and resurrection and experience true transformation in our lives during this powerful season. One way we're doing this by engaging with a new program from Ascension-**The Ascension Lenten Companion**. This resource follows the Gospel readings for each Sunday of this Lent to help us prepare better for Mass and grow closer to Jesus each day. It has daily meditations, prayer prompts, space for journaling, original sacred artwork, and weekly videos.

Because we want this Lent to be a journey we take together as a parish. Each participant will receive **The Ascension Lenten Companion** to use throughout the Lenten season, The journal cost is **\$10.00**.

This is an opportunity for our whole community to enter into the season of Lent intentionally and receive the grace God is waiting to give us during this holy season. FROM THE PASTOR

Luke 5: 1-11 – 5th Sunday Ordinary Time
"What It Takes to be a Disciple"

The calling of the first disciples in today's Gospel outlines some of the qualities Jesus looks for in those He invites to share His mission. These fishermen are hard workers. They are also well acquainted with hardships and disappointments. They do not lead lives of ease. The unpredictability of a fisherman's life fosters in them a deep sense of humility. What's more, they have a strong sense of personal loyalty. They are ready to commit themselves to someone they respect and admire. The first disciples called by Jesus were remarkable for their ordinariness. They were very human-like all of us. To what extent do we share the qualities of the first disciples? Are we willing to work hard? How do we cope with hardship and disappointment? Are we humble? Do we have a strong sense of loyalty to Jesus? Ask Our Lord to foster the growth of these qualities in us, His disciples.

St. Joseph's Table

The year of St. Joseph has ended, but we would like to honor him on his Feast Day on Saturday March 19, 2022. Fr. Piotr will celebrate Mass and we will recite the Litany of St. Joseph together. After Mass we would like to have a St. Joseph's table for all. We are aware that Covid is still a concern, but we are hoping by March we can safely gather as a parish to celebrate this special day. We will have a sign-up sheet in the narthex of both churches starting this weekend, to see what kind of interest we have in the spaghetti dinner. You must reserve ahead of time as we will not be doing walk-ins on that day.

The origins of St. Joseph's Table can be traced to the Middle Ages. According to one tradition, during a famine brought on by a severe drought, starving villagers-many of them farmers-prayed to St. Joseph, asking for his intercession. St. Joseph helped them to survive by eating the Fava Bean. It was the only crop that would grow in such harsh conditions. So bountiful the crop became that the famine ended. To offer their thanks the people prepared a special feast, inviting the poor and less fortunate among them to share in the meal. The Feast of St. Joseph's Table has been celebrated ever since.
