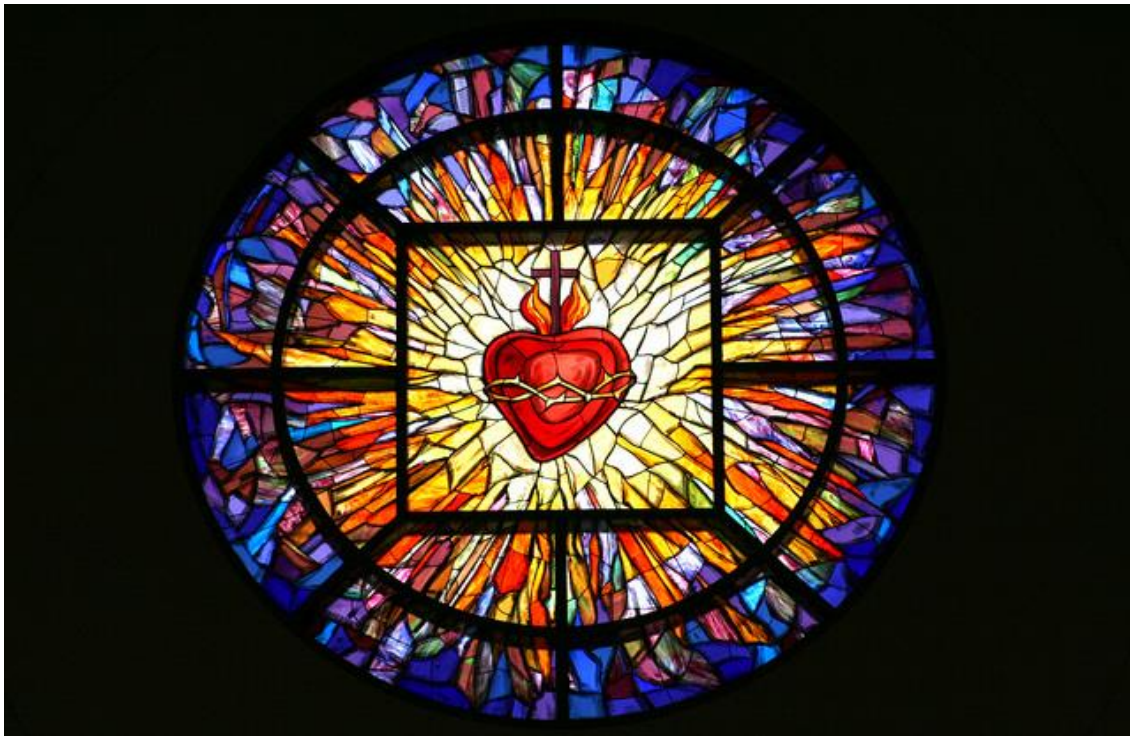

WARMER WEATHER

With the coming of summer temperatures, the air conditioning in Lakewood will be in use. If you prefer it cooler, sit near the center aisle, in line with one of the units on the wall. Warmer seats can be found near the walls, in pews that are not directly below an air conditioning unit. And, if you are sensitive to cooler temperatures, you might want to consider bringing a sweater to be more comfortable.

TIPS TO HELP STAY FOCUSED AT MASS

We are all human and keeping distractions at bay during Mass can be a difficult task. Between everything bouncing around in our minds, the distractions in the pews around us, and our own families, it takes a lot of effort to keep our minds from wandering. Here are some tips that might help to limit at least some of the distractions.

Turn off the car radio on the way to Mass – start clearing your distractions in advance by turning of the radio, shutting off your phone, and quieting the conversations in the car.

Get to Mass ten minutes early – spend a few minutes in quiet prayer before Mass begins. Bring to mind that you are now in the presence of God and thank Him for the gift of grace.

Sit close to the front – it is much easier to stay focused and be less distracted by what is happening around you.

Keep your hands folded in prayer – posture is important to prayer; let your body remind you of what your heart and mind should be doing. There is a reason why we teach this to our children.

Fully participate in the Mass – say all the prayers, sing all the songs, follow along in the missalette, think about how the readings, the psalm, and the homily connect.

Bring back those wandering thoughts – Mass is a place where heaven meets earth. Each time you are distracted, bring your mind back to where you are, even if you have to do it 100 times!

Intentionally add your intentions and sacrifices to the prayers of the Mass – two things you can bring with you to every Mass are the special intentions that you're praying for and the personal sacrifices that you're uniting to Christ's one great sacrifice. At the time of the consecration when the priest says, "Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father," consciously think of what these things are for you.

Ask for help – if you want to keep distractions away during Mass, just ask. Your guardian angel exists to help you with things like this.
