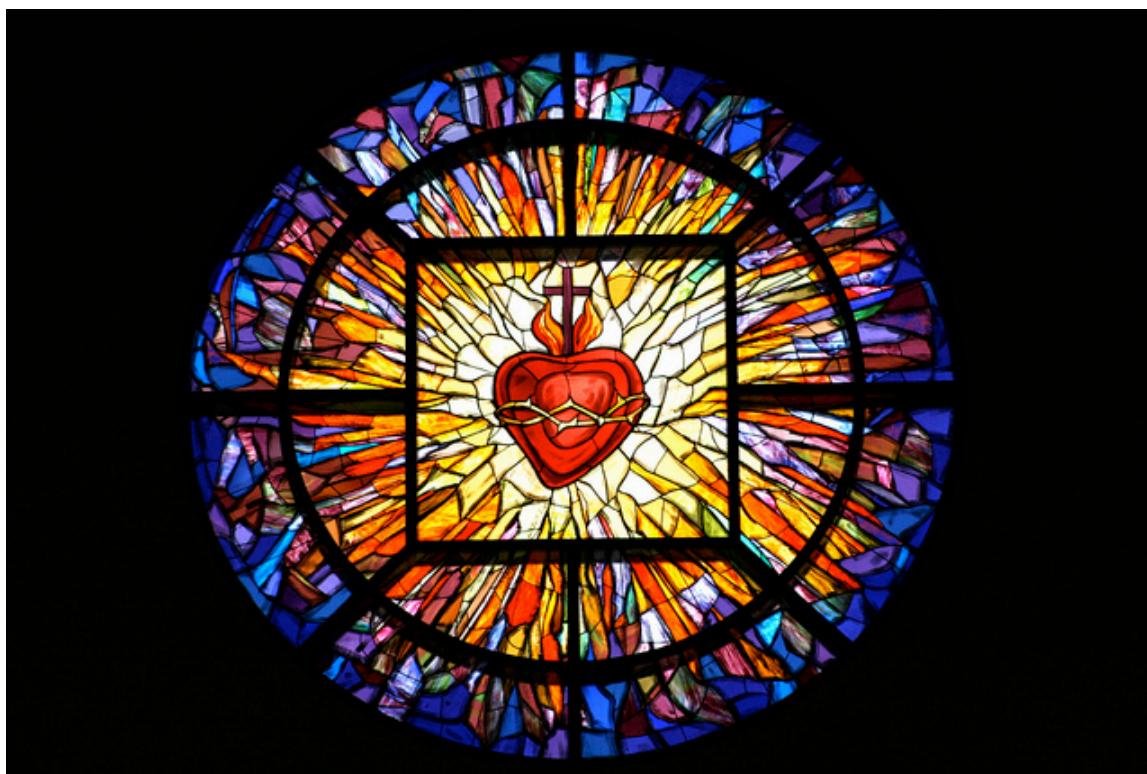

SACRED HEART ALTAR AND ROSARY SOCIETY

It is now time for the annual membership drive of the Sacred Heart Altar and Rosary Society. Membership in the Altar and Rosary Society is open to all women of the parish. Some of the activities of the society include two bake sales/basket raffles each year, the spring rummage sale, cleaning the altar of our church in Lakewood, and a picnic in June. Proceeds from fundraisers are used to enhance the altar (for example, the purchase of altar cloths and vestments) and, this year, to help fund the scholarships awarded to graduating seniors. Every member does not have to participate in every activity but can be part of those events that fit into their schedules.

Those wishing to join are invited to pick up a dues envelope from the vestibule of the church in Lakewood after Mass any weekend this month. Dues are only \$5!

MEANING OF LITURGICAL COLORS

As you go to Mass throughout the year, you'll notice that the priest is dressed in different colors at different times. Why is that? And what do these different colors mean?

First, the Catholic Mass engages all of our senses. With the different colors, our eyes draw our minds to that which they represent, helping us journey with Christ.

Each of the colors that you'll see the priest wear have a symbolic meaning. For much of the year, or Ordinary Time, the color is green. This symbolizes life and hope.

Occasionally, the priest will wear white vestments. This is done during the seasons of Christmas and Easter, on feasts dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, to the angels and to saints who are not martyrs. White symbolizes joy and victory.

Red vestments have a couple of different symbolic meanings. Red sometimes signifies blood. This is why red vestments are worn on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, and on the feast days of martyrs (who shed their blood for the faith) and the Apostles. Other times red signifies the Holy Spirit. This is why you'll see the priest in red on Pentecost.

During Advent and Lent, the color is purple. This is to symbolize penance.

Finally, on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent, you may see the priest in pink or rose vestments. This symbolizes the joy of anticipation for Christmas and Easter.
