

From the Desk of Fr. Paul

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday!

A couple years ago, I was very moved by a book titled, "The Second Greatest Story Ever Told" by Fr. Michael Gaitley. This provokes the question, "Well... What is the first greatest story?" Of course, the first greatest story is what we celebrated together just a couple days ago, the Paschal Mystery, Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. It is certainly the greatest story because without it we wouldn't have been saved by the Savior of the world! But what is the second greatest story? Fr. Michael Gaitley suggests that the second greatest story happened within the past century where a few crucial events took place, the emergence of the Divine Mercy devotions, the life of St. John Paul II and the immense role that Marian consecration can play in our lives. The crescendo of events that took place in the 20th century is astounding to say the least. It was a period that seemingly saw the greatest suffering humanity had ever experienced, from World War II to the rise and fall of the iron curtain. But throughout this all, God had a plan of the cultivating of devotion to the Divine Mercy of Jesus and consecration to the Blessed Virgin Mary that was promoted by the papacy of St. John Paul II that lifted the world in a time of incredible strife. You will have to read the book if you want to see how Father Gaitley shows what an incredible story this really is.

Of course, the focus on God's mercy is not unique to the last 100+ years. The Hebrew word, "Hesed" is found multiple times throughout the Old Testament. It refers to the steadfast love that God has for His people. God established covenants between Himself and His people that solidified his commitment to steadfast love throughout their generations. In other words, God's love is unwavering, unchanging, and not conditional. God brings us His mercy and love for those who open their hearts to Him in repentance and love. This Scriptural theme is what we celebrate during Divine Mercy Sunday. This is not a new devotion "discovered" by St. Faustina in the early 1900's. Rather, this devotion is built upon the Scriptural foundation of God's steadfast love, a love that is seen ultimately in Christ's sacrifice on the Cross as blood and water poured forth from His side.

During the nine-day Divine Mercy Novena, each individual day focuses on a certain group of people that Jesus desires His mercy to reach. These include mercy for sinners, for souls of priests and religious, for devout and faithful souls, for those who do not believe in God, for souls of those who are separated from the Church, for meek and humble souls of children, for souls who especially glorify His mercy, for souls in purgatory and for souls who have become lukewarm. Jesus so desires His mercy to be poured out to all of us. In fact, in St. Faustina's diary, she wrote that Jesus' longing for us to open our hearts to him is so great and all we need to do is open our hearts just a little bit and His mercy will flood in. So, what is preventing us from giving this small 'yes' to the Lord? Invite the Lord's mercy and love into your life and you will find true peace and love that can't be found anywhere else. May God bless you and your family on this beautiful day! Have a blessed Divine Mercy Sunday!
