From the Desk of Fr. Paul

"I thirst"- John 19:28

These words which Jesus painfully said on the Cross are found apinted or placed beside every crucifix in the convents of the Missionaries of Charity. In the image below you'll see what I'm describing. Jesus' words were a major theme for the mission of Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta and her religious sisters. What did Jesus thirst for? There are a few answers to this question. Theologically, Jesus thirsted for the new and everlasting covenant to be completed, to drink the final cup of His Priestly Sacrifice. In addition to this underlying thological purpose. Jesus thirsts for us, for our submissive yes to His will, for our love to be offered to Jesus. In short, Jesus thirst for our love.

Let's call to mind when Jesus shared the parable of the shepp and the goats int the Gospel of Mathew. As the sheep and the goats were seperated, Jesus commended the sheep for giving food to Jesus when He was hungry, drink when He was sick and visitation when He was in prson and He condemned the goats for not doing so. All of these charitable acts are echoed in the corporal works of mercy. When we perform one of the corporal works of mercy, we are giving our love to Jesus on the Cross.

No wonder Mother Teresa focused on the theme of "I thirst". I became the foundation of her mission and misistry, as she served the poorest of the poor and those who were dying whe was really feeding, healing and assisting Jesus.

What comes to mind when you reflect on the words, "I thirst." Is the Lord thirsting for us to spend more time with Him in prayer? Is He thirsting for our commitment to going to Mass on Sundays? Is He thirsting for our outreach to those who are in need whether it be your family, friends or community? Is He thirsting for our conversion and turning away from habitual sin?

What is common in all of these questions is that Jesus thirsts for our love. We don't need to come to Christ with the perfect answers, with our lives all figured our or fancy words. All we need to do is bring ourselves. He thirsts for us, He thirsts for our love.

I highly encourage you to look up "I Thirst For You" - A- Letter from Mother Teresa" online. Then you can hear in her own words her beautiful reflection on Jesus' words on the cross.
