From the Desk of Fr. Paul

Oftentimes when people are curious about the Catholic Church or are interested in becoming Catholic a consistent hang up that some have is devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. This is understandable, especially if someone has grown up in the Protestant tradition where Mary’s importance is limited to that she is the mother of God. Statues of Mary, devotions such as the Rosary and litanies, and Catholic beliefs in Mary’s Immaculate Conception and Assumption can be a little overwhelming to the one looking in from the outside.

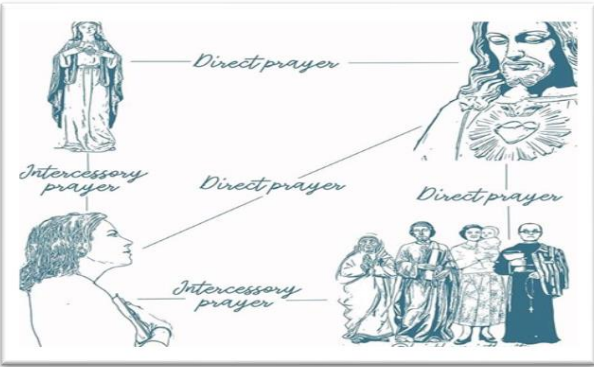
But what if I were to tell you that the very early Christians had a devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary? It is true! Devotion to Mary was not a creation of the medieval ages, but rather one all the way from the 3rd century! The oldest known prayer to Mary is called the *Sub Tuum Praesidium* and the most extant manuscript containing this prayer is on Egyptian papyrus written in Greek carbon dated to be in the 3rd century. Here is the prayer:

*We fly to thy patronage,
O holy Mother of God.
despise not our petitions in our necessities,
but deliver us always from all dangers,
O glorious and blessed Virgin.
Amen.*

In the Gospel of Luke, Mary gave her Magnificat glorifying the Lord where she exclaims, “All generations will call me blessed. The almighty has done great things for me and Holy is His name!” (Luke 1:48) The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that “the Church’s devotion to the Blessed Virgin is intrinsic to Christian worship.” (par. 971) In honoring Mary in this way, we are not offering worship, which is only due to God, but rather asking Mary to be an intercessor for us to God. If we approach Mary with our prayers and needs, she brings those prayers to Jesus Himself. And how can Jesus refuse His mother?

Below you can find a picture that is helpful to visualize the difference between direct prayer and intercessory prayer. When we ask for the Blessed Mother or the saints for intercessory prayer, they bring those prayers straight to God.

So, we should never be afraid to approach Mary, our spiritual mother! We pray that she may wrap us in her mantle of love, protection, and grace.
