

From The Desk of Fr. Paul

This week, we will celebrate the Memorial of a very beloved saint, St. Pio of Pietrelcina, more widely known as Padre Pio. The memorial is on Friday, September 23rd. There is growing interest nationally in St. Pio now with a new and upcoming movie simply called "Padre Pio" played by Shia LaBeouf. This actor does have a bit of a checkered past, but his journey of conversion to the Catholic faith beginning by his research of Padre Pio is fascinating to say the least. If you are interested in learning more about Shia's journey in learning more about Padre Pio and the Catholic faith, I encourage you to watch the YouTube video called, "Bishop Barron Presents | Shia LaBeouf - Padre Pio and the Friars." Bishop Robert Barron does a great job interviewing him and finding out about his conversion story. With that said, I am always a bit wary and cautiously hopeful of celebrity conversions like this. But at the very least, the video portrays a spiritual progression and what seems to me a very genuine search for the truth on Shia's part. I believe the movie will be coming out sometime this Fall if anyone is interested in watching it. I sure am, but again, I also am cautiously hopeful.

What makes St. Pio such an interesting figure is that he is a modern saint, one who was alive during many people's living memory. Where modern science and thought have ruled out miracles as a medieval fairytale, we have a modern saint who exhibited many miracles, too many to count. Such as, the stigmata, reading of souls during Confession, bilocation, and many others; not to mention that after his death his body was found to be incorrupt. Many of these miracles were well documented and even scientifically tested to see if there were any earthly explanations for what was happening to Padre Pio. But what was evident was his deeply spiritual personality and intimate relationship with Jesus which defined him. It is said that he would have Masses lasting longer than three hours on a regular basis. Every Mass was a deeply personal and emotional event for him as he would weep in the presence of Christ truly present in the Eucharist. And he would be in the confessional for hours with people coming from all over to have their Confession heard by him.

I know that many people in our area have a profound devotion to Padre Pio and I can see why. His saintliness and his very life point to the importance of having a strong faith. Faith is the basis for all the other virtues. When God gives us the gift of faith, we will learn to have hope and love, when we have faith in the goodness of God, we can see how God is working in all areas of our life. We may not have the stigmata or bilocate or read souls, but miracles of God are around us each and every single day if we are looking closely enough and see with eyes of faith.

On Sept. 23rd, I plan on bringing my 1st class relic of St. Pio of Pietrelcina to Mass so I can bless all present with it. Let us pray through St. Pio's intercession that we may have an increase of faith and to see how God is working in our lives.
