From the Desk of Fr. Paul

Over twenty years ago in 2002, Pope Saint John Paul II established the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary. I remember first praying the Luminous Mysteries as a twelve-year-old and thinking, "about time!" I had always felt that there was a big jump from the Joyful to the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary. We went from Jesus being lost in the Temple straight to the Agony in the Garden without even glossing over Jesus' public ministry. But now with the very aptly named Luminous Mysteries, we are reminded how the teaching, healing and daily life of Jesus' ministry illuminates our faith life. The Luminous Mysteries are to be prayed on Thursdays.

If you need a little refresher here are the five Luminous Mysteries:

- 1. The Baptism of Jesus
- 2. The Wedding Feast of Cana
- 3. The Proclamation of the Kingdom and Call to Repentance
- 4. The Transfiguration
- 5. The Institution of the Holy Eucharist

I have grown to appreciate that the Luminous Mysteries either explicitly or implicitly contain the seven Sacraments instituted by Jesus Himself. While St. John the Baptist's baptism was one of repentance, it points to the Baptism that Jesus will soon institute, one of rebirth as a child of God. The Sacrament of Matrimony is found within the Wedding Feast of Cana where Jesus blesses the couple with His presence and also His very first public miracle. The Sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick are found within the third Mystery where Jesus forgives the sins of those seeking His healing, promises that He will soon send His Holy Spirit, and spends much of his public ministry healing those of mind, body and spirit. Both the Eucharist and Holy Orders are found within the final Mystery where Jesus makes His Eucharistic presence known to the very first priests of the Church as He tells His apostles, "Do this in remembrance of Me"

And we can't forget the fourth Mystery the Transfiguration which we celebrate this Sunday. This Mystery points to the reality of Jesus' hypostatic union, that He is fully God and fully man. As His appearance is transfigured before the three Apostles, God the Father's voice reminds them to listen to His beloved Son Jesus. Let us also listen attentively to the voice of God in our lives.

The Sacraments provide the very life of God dwelling within us, His grace into our lives. The next time you pray the Luminous Mysteries you can thank God for His gift of the Sacraments. May reflection on these Mysteries illuminate our faith life.
