## From the Desk of Fr. Paul Cygan Happy Saint Valentine's Day

As Catholics, we should remember to put "Saint" in front of Valentine's Day because Saint Valentine was a real and historical figure! So as your give roses, gifts and chocolates to your sweetheart also keep in mind this  $3^{\rm rd}$  century bishop of the church.

His story is actually quite romantic. Let me explain. As you know, the early Church in Rome endured many tyrannical emperors who persecuted the Church. During Emperor Claudius' reign. Christians were persecuted and were often sent to the Roman games to be martyred. Saint Valentine as a good and faithful bishop sided the early Church by hiding Christians, celebrating the Sacraments for them clandestinely, and visiting Christians in prison. His bravery in his pastoral ministry found him in prison himself multiple times. During this time, Christians were forbidden by the state to be married in the Church. Saint Valentine risked his life by marrying Christian couples in secret. What is more romantic than that? Saint Valentine dedicated his life to sanctifying the gift of love through the Sacrament of marriage.

During his final imprisonment, Saint Valentine would write letters to his faithful, encouraging them and exhorting them, to hold fast to the faith. The practice of giving Valentine cards to your sweetheart originates from these letters of Saint Valentine. There is a legend that Saint wrote a final letter to a girl the day he was martyred. He signed the letter, "Your Valentine." While he was imprisoned, he refused to sacrifice pagan idols, prayed devoutly, converted fellow prisoners, and even managed to heal a jail guard's blind daughter.

As with many historical figures of antiquity, there are some credible facts about them and some that are enhanced by legend. However, a little background on Saint Valentine whether it be historical, or legend adds some context to this special day of honoring our loved ones.

So, on this happy and lovely day, we remember first of all the love that God has for us that is always overflowing and never ending, and we remember the love of saints like Saint Valentine whose life was dedicated to the love of God. Happy Saint Valentine's Day.
