#### From the desk of Teko-Agbo, Teko:

My name is Teko-Agbo, Teko. I am 33 years old. I was born and grew up in Togo, Western Africa. My family moved to Northern Virginia when I was 18. I have 3 siblings, all boys; I am the second older one. All my brothers reside in the Washington DC area. I moved to the West side of Buffalo in August of 2014 when I joined the Oblates of Mary Immaculate. I studied Philosophy at d'Youville college. I ended up discerning out of the Oblates of Mary

Immaculate and remained in Buffalo for the next 5 years. I worked with Erie County, department of Family services as a caseworker. My work entailed the investigation of Child & Adult neglect abuse of maltreatment. I really liked the work, since it was very rewarding as we did our best to protect the most vulnerable people throughout the County. Amid employment, my vocation to the priesthood never left me. I continued to feel the ever so soft pull of God to serve as a priest. Last summer, God gave me the grace to respond, and I was accepted by the Diocese of Buffalo.

I completed my first year of Theology at St. Mary's Seminary & University in Baltimore, MD. I am assigned to the family of parishes here in Jamestown, NY for the Summer. So far, I have come to appreciate rural life very much. I myself grew up in a rural setting. The life here is calm, and very serene. The people are extremely warm, and all the foliage speak of God's constant sustenance of the universe and all it contains. Now I can say with the Psalmist:

"When I look at "Jamestown, NY" the work of your fingers, the moon, and the stars.
