**A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR**

**The Baptism of the Lord**

Traditionally as the Church commemorates Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River by his cousin, John the Baptist, the Popes have celebrated Mass on this feast in the Sistine Chapel baptizing around 30 babies. Last year, Pope Francis encouraged the families who were there with their babies for baptism that "...in Baptism we give him or her a treasure, we give them a pledge: The Holy Spirit. It is important to baptize children, so that they grow up with the power of the Holy Spirit." He also encouraged the families to raise their children by nurturing this gift of the Holy Spirit in them through catechesis, teaching, and a lived out example in their homes.

Due to the pandemic, we have moved to doing private and single family baptisms, but really baptisms are meant for the community, because the child becomes a new member of our family of faith. Last year in 2020, despite the pandemic and limits on gathering in person, we still celebrated a few baptisms! Children are welcome at our Masses and it is okay if they cry. When a child cries in church, it's a beautiful sound of us being alive!

**End of the Christmas Season**

The Christmas season, celebrating the self-revelation of God through Jesus, comes to an end with the feast of the Baptism of Our Lord. Christmas is the feast of God's self-revelation to the Jews, and Epiphany celebrates God's self-revelation to the Gentiles. At his Baptism in the Jordan, Christ reveals himself to repentant sinners. Jesus' baptism, which is described in all four Gospels, also marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, which started 30 years after his birth.

As we conclude the Christmas Season, I want to echo again my deepest gratitude to the entire parish for your participation, generosity, and goodness. Coming into the Christmas Season during this pandemic, I felt as if we had some things working against us, and I worried about how things would turn out. Your response has been always overwhelming! Your generosity shined through and we were able to continue our outreach to those in need in our community.

Those involved in our Christmas Masses deserve to be commended for your efforts and help in making our Masses beautiful and keeping everyone who attended safe.

And thank you all again for your very kind cards, gifts, and words of support that I received in these weeks. I heard from many families who have been staying safe at home and it was great to see your pictures and hear how your families are doing. It truly makes me feel so grateful to be a part of this amazing parish family. By working together and making the best of our situation, you made this Christmas special for our parish family, and I will forever be grateful for you!
