FROM THE PASTOR

Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24—13th Sunday in Ordinary Time
"Original Sin"

In today's first reading we read: " ...by the envy of the devil, death entered the world..." (v24). Death is the result of Adam's sin, which for him was an actual sin of pride and disobedience (Gen 3). However, this sin, the "original sin" has affected the whole human family. Original sin implies no injustice on the part of God. Yes, Adam lost all his supernatural and preternatural gifts, not only for himself but for all of us as well, but those gifts were neither Adam's nor ours by right of our nature. God only gave them to Adam gratuitously, on the one condition that Adam does not eat of the tree. Original sin does not brand us with the positive guilt of actual or personal sin, nor does it cause man to lose anything that is his right by nature. Original sin is a doctrine of the Church, and we are obligated to believe it.
