From The Desk of Fr. Paul

Imagine for a while that you are entering into a Catholic Church before Mass for the very first time. Maybe you are new to the Catholic faith, and you see people around you doing some interesting things, dipping their fingers in a bowl of water and then waving their hands around their face and body, getting down on one knee before going into the pew, standing, sitting, kneeling at what seems like random parts of the Mass. This is what I like to call Catholic calisthenics. There certainly are a lot of gestures and symbols that we have in the Catholic tradition. And raised in this tradition, all of this seems second nature. But sometimes it is important to call to mind the intention and purpose of these gestures to help us orient our minds and souls towards worship of our almighty God.

The symbol and gesture that I want to highlight today is the tri fold blessing before the Gospel is read. Remember how when the priest says, "A reading from the Holy Gospel according to ____." the response of the congregation is, "Glory to You, O Lord." During that response, we all make three signs of the cross with our thumb over our forehead, our lips and then our heart. Why do we do this?

First of all, the sign of the cross is itself a sign of our salvation. We call to mind that we go to the cross of Jesus to be saved from our sin. And one of the ways that we get to know who Jesus is, is through the Word of God, where He speaks to us.

Secondly, we are asking to be purified to be able to not only understand God's Word, but to allow for God's Word to enter within us deeply. St. Paul talks about this in Hebrews 4:12, "For the Word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart." When we bless our foreheads, we pray that we may understand what God is trying to tell us. When we bless our lips, we pray that we may be able to be prophets in this present time and proclaim the Gospel in our world. When we bless our hearts, we ask that God's Word may impact us at the very core of who we are, that we don't just give lip service, but we allow for God's conversion to take place within us.

After we have blessed ourselves in this way, then we are prepared to listen to the Gospel. So, the next time you are at Mass, we can pray in this way, "Lord, help me to allow the Word of God to be ever in my mind, to be proclaimed by my lips and to pierce my heart leading me to deeper communion with You!"
