From the Desk of Fr. Paul

Happy Memorial Day Weekend everyone! Today, we pray for and remember all of our brave men and women in the armed services who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our country and for the consolation of families and friends who mourn their loss.

As you may have noticed, I have written about the Blessed Virgin Mary every single week during the month of May. I'd like to take this opportunity on the last weekend of May to do more of the same. As we celebrate this Memorial Day, I want to reflect on the Dormition and Assumption of Mary. Mary's assumption into heaven body and soul is a dogma of the Catholic Church which means that it is a tenet of our faith that cannot be refused; it is a principle of belief of the highest order. Pope Pius XII solemnly defined in his apostolic constitution, *Munificentissimus Deus*, on November 1, 1950, that, "the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever-virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." Now this opens up an interesting question. Did Mary first die before being assumed? Did she fall "asleep"? Was she buried? The Church does not bind us to a particular answer because there are multiple traditions that exist. Case in point, Pope Pius XII doesn't exactly clarify whether Mary died or not, but rather that she was assumed, "when the course of her earthly life was completed."

In the Eastern Catholic Church, the tradition of the dormition of Mary is quite prevalent, meaning that before Mary was assumed into heaven, she endured a temporary bodily death. According to St. Juvenal, the bishop of Jerusalem, at the Council of Chalcedon (AD 451), when Mary endured her dormition or sleep, all the apostles returned to Jerusalem to be with Mary at her bedside. Following this, Mary was either assumed body and soul into heaven or her body was buried and then assumed at a later time.

The Roman Catholic tradition of Mary's Assumption can include either a dormition of Mary or that she was assumed body and soul without a dormition. The latter would strengthen the Marian theology of Mary's Immaculate Conception insofar as Mary was completely sinless and thereby did not suffer the effects of sin including death. However, both traditions are valid and have their theological merit. The fundamental belief remains the same. The Catechism, quoting the Byzantine Liturgy, states, "The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians: 'In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You were conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death." (CCC par. 966)

May the Blessed Mother be our shining light in our lives. Her assumption into heaven reminds us of our heavenly home and that we too are called to be in everlasting joy with God.

Have a blessed Memorial Day weekend. Eternal rest grant unto our fallen armed service men and women O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace.
