

SACRAMENTS

Let's talk about sacraments, since it is that time of the year for our young people to make their sacraments. Do you remember how many sacraments there are? Do you remember what they mean? Do you remember how special it was to make your sacraments? We will have a refresher over the next several weeks.

There are seven sacraments in the Catholic Church. We begin with the Sacraments of Initiation

Baptism-When we are born, we all have original sin. It was the one first committed by Adam and Eve. When baptized, we are washed of that sin and of all those committed before receiving it. We are made sons and daughters of God and we officially become a part of the Church.

Confirmation-Is as simple as the Holy Spirit, who is God increasing our faith so that we have the certainty that He is with us until we arrive in Heaven, for which He also gives us hope. During this Sacrament, the Holy Spirit strengthens us and our ability to love Him and others more deeply. The Holy Spirit give us seven gifts to help us do that. We teach our faith formation students to use the acronym PUFFWCK to make them easier to remember. Piety, Understanding, Fear of the Lord, Fortitude, Wisdom, Council and Knowledge

Eucharist-Every day, Jesus turns bread and wine into His Body and Blood during the Holy Mass. This happens at the moment called the Consecration. This way we can eat and receive Him in our soul. Jesus instituted this Sacrament during the Last Supper with the twelve apostles. This sacrament has a bonus: it forgives venial sin and fortifies us against committing mortal ones in the future. It is Jesus Himself who is within us.

FROM THE PASTOR

1 John 2:1-5-3rd Sunday in Easter

In the second reading St. John writes: "My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin" (v1). The Catechism tells us the gravity of sin: "Sin is an offense against God... (it) sets itself against God's love for us and turns our hearts away from it" (CCC 1850). In the order of effects for us today, the loss of God is the definitive evil. Sin is the only thing we ever need to truly fear because it is the only that can cause us to suffer the loss of God for all eternity. Cancer cannot separate us from God; nor can a heart condition or emotional stress. When we sin we abuse the freedom God gave us and we either break or weaken our friendship with God. Sin also causes disharmony within us, resulting in a break in the peace and unity that should exist between our bodies and our souls.
